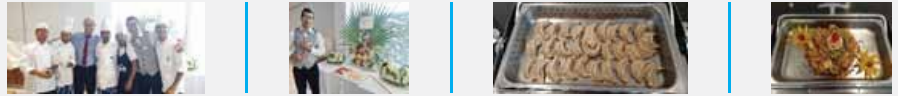

Our students building their career in the hotel industry

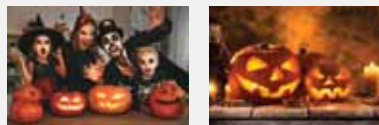

We look back in history and commemorate!

1st of October 1960, Cyprus

The Republic of Cyprus came into being on August 19th 1960. On the stroke of midnight on October 1st 1960, the agreement of independence between the United Kingdom, Greece and Turkey and the British governor read a British proclamation declaring the independence of Cyprus. The day is celebrated by festivals at the schools and a large military parade in Nicosia.



28th of October 1940, Greece

The 28th of October, also called 'Ohi Day' (/ohi/ in Greek means 'no') is celebrated throughout Greece and Cyprus as it commemorates the rejection of the ultimatum which demanded Greece allow Axis forces (Germany, Italy and Japan) to enter the Greek territory. In response, the Italian troops attacked Greece and that signified the beginning of Greece's participation in World War II. After World War II, this day became a public holiday celebrated every year with military and student parades.
