How to write a cover letter

A cover letter is among the most useful types of letters. It is submitted as part of a job application (alongside your CV). Its purpose is to introduce you and briefly summarise your professional background. The format of a good cover letter is as follows:

- Greeting
- 1st paragraph: describe 2-3 of your top achievements
- 2nd paragraph: explain why you are the perfect candidate for the job
- 3rd paragraph: explain why you are a good match for the company
- Formal closing
