Welcoming Our New Students

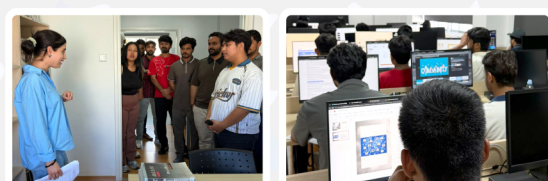

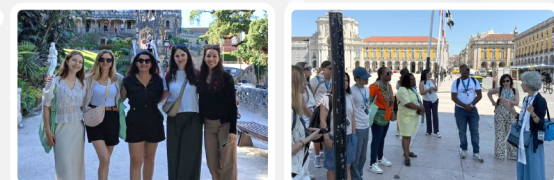

Erasmus+ Mobility in Lisbon

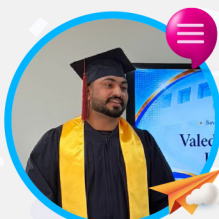
